Subject: Applications for Advanced Tradesman Licence

Effective Date: 1st August 2010 Revised: 31st August 2020

The Plumbers & Drainers Licensing Act states that, to qualify for an Advanced Tradesman's licence, an applicant must demonstrate that he/she is competent to:

- (i) assess the scope and technical requirements of plumbing or draining under a contract; and
- (ii) determine the skills necessary to carry out the work; and
- (iii) put in place appropriate arrangements for carrying out the work properly and safely in compliance with the prescribed Acts.

The Plumbers & Drainers Licensing Board (PDLB) has determined that, in order to demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the Act, applicants must provide evidence to show that they have:

- 1. Completed two years post-trade work experience in plumbing/draining from the date of issue of unconditional Journeyman Registration Card in Australia; and
- 2. Completed the following 10 units of competency from the CPC40912 Certificate IV in Plumbing and Services Package. A document stating how the grades were attained must accompany any application from the Registered Training Organisation (RTO).
- 3. PDLB will recognize an Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) accreditation for the Water, Sanitary or Drainage units only if the criteria listed below is met;
 - a. The RTO has <u>Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA)</u> accreditation to deliver training products in the Northern Territory (NT).
 - b. Sufficient evidence is submitted with the application to show competence against the units that have the RPL grading.
 - c. PDLB reserves the right to request supplementary evidence from the individual.
 - d. A challenge test may also be required. PDLB's decision is final.
- 4. If an applicant feels they have the necessary skill set, they may provide a brief of evidence. It must be sufficient to show the individual has the skills and expertise required.
- 5. PDLB may also request supplementary evidence from the individual.
- 6. A challenge test may also be required. PDLB's decision is final.
- 7. All additional evidence must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration which states the brief of evidence is that of the applicant.
